Now is the time for the City to dig more deeply into solar installation (in pursuit of the 25x25 goal), given the increased availability of solar panels (thanks in part to Inflation Reduction Act) relative to when the 25x25 plan was adopted.

Will invite Mark Ables Allison of Bayfield county to a future Sustainability Committee meeting, so that we can learn more about how Bayfield county was able to invest so much in solar.

Increased investment in solar systems is great for creating local jobs installing/maintaining those systems.

Adam going to put together a list of incentives for the City to invest more in new solar arrays in coming years.
